November. Mrs Lowry will then provide you with some very basic details of the recipient (no names). It's not about a big bold gesture, more a simple way to spread some kindness and show that we care, so please don't get carried away. This is not for someone in need of food, it is more about reaching out to someone who needs a bit of a lift. Hampers should have no more than 15 items in them. Sweets, biscuits, jams, a nice bottle of juice, that sort of thing. The most important thing your children could include is a hand drawn Christmas card with a message inside. This will mean more to the person or family than anything.

Hampers will be collected from the school on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> December to be distributed on Saturday 19<sup>th</sup> December (allowing the hampers a quarantine period).
